# Ceres Highland Games Terms and Conditions for Stall Holders

The following terms and conditions, and all other directions given by Ceres Highland Games officials, must be adhered to:

## Applications

1. Applications for a trader's pitch at the Ceres Highland Games can only be made on the appropriate application form.
2. Once received, your application and supporting documentation will be reviewed, and if successful our invoice for payment will be sent.
  - Pitches are not guaranteed until payment and all relevant documentation has been received and confirmed by us.
  - Our preferred method of payment is by bank transfer. Our account details are included on our invoice.
3. Ceres Highland Games reserve the right to allocate stalls as they wish.

## Pitches

1. Full instructions in relation to set up and clear down will be sent to approved traders the week before the event.
2. The roads around the Games arena will be closed from 8am, reopening at 6pm.
  - Due to space limitations, no vehicles can be parked next to stalls and all vehicles must be unloaded and parked in the designated car park by 8.30am.
  - Traders will be given one parking pass which will allow one vehicle to be parked free of charge. All other vehicles must pay the appropriate car parking fee.
  - Stalls can only be broken down after the Games have finished or when asked to by a Ceres Highland Games official.
1. All stalls will be erected on the road or the village car park. Traders are responsible for bringing their own gazebo, weights and other equipment. The Games Committee have a limited number of gazebos available for traders – these must be reserved in advance of the event on a first come, first served basis. Throughout the event traders will be considered responsible for any borrowed equipment on their pitch.
  - All stalls must comply with the dimensions applied for and agreed.
3. Any damage caused to third party property by a trader's equipment is the responsibility of that trader.
4. All stallholders are required, by law, to hold valid and up-to-date public liability Insurance against injury or damage to any party. The Games insurers will not cover ANY stallholder's responsibility.
  - In addition, it's recommended that stallholders have adequate insurance cover for their stalls and goods. Any goods unattended on stalls before, during, or after the Games are left at the owner's risk.
  - The Ceres Highland Games can take no responsibility for damage to, or loss of stall-holder's property while at or in transit to/from the Games site.
5. Alcohol cannot be sold from any stalls without prior agreement from Ceres Highland Games and appropriate licences in place.
6. Stallholders must ensure that retail units and the equipment they use and/or relevant licence, complies with all relevant health and safety, and environmental health regulations. Ceres Highland Games reserves the right to exclude any item or person from the event where it is felt that they do not meet the current statutory requirements.
7. All Stallholders are responsible for the collection and disposal of rubbish from their stall.
8. Each stallholder will be issued with one car parking permit on the day.
9. The Games Committee will apply for a Market Operators licence from Fife Council. However, traders are expected to meet any licenced trader requirements and must provide the Ceres Highland Games with a copy of any licences and/or relevant supporting documentation including that for food stalls and, where appropriate, alcohol on and off sales.
  - There is no water or electricity supply on site; stallholders may only use generators at the discretion of the Ceres Highland Games and should seek prior approval.
  - Stallholders must respect resident's rights with regard to access, privacy, noise, litter, pollution, etc.
10. Charity collection buckets may only be displayed on stalls - no soliciting in front of the stall or anywhere else in the vicinity of the Games is permitted.

## Refunds

1. Should a trader need to withdraw from the event they should inform the Ceres Highland Games as soon as possible by emailing [eventcoord@ceresfames.co.uk](mailto:eventcoord@ceresfames.co.uk). Refunds will be issued on the following basis:

More than eight weeks before the event (or upon cancellation of the Games)	Full refund
Between eight and four weeks before the event	50% refund
Less than four weeks before the event	No refund
